"Walk to Emmaus"

The focus of Emmaus is God as known in Jesus Christ and how that finds expression in the local church. The objective is to inspire, challenge, and equip local church members for Christian action in their home, churches, and places of work. Emmaus lifts up a way for our grace-filled life to be lived and shared with others.

The "Walk to Emmaus" is a 72-hour experience. The weekend begins on Thursday evening and ends Sunday evening. At Emmaus you spend three busy but very enjoyable days, at a retreat center. You will live and study together in singing, prayer, worship, and discussion. Discussions center around fifteen talks given by laity and clergy. These talks present the theme of God's grace, and how that grace comes alive in the Christian community and expresses itself in the world. You'll also discover how grace is real in your life, and how you can live in the life of grace, bringing grace to others. You will have the opportunity to participate in the daily celebration of Holy Communion, and to begin to understand more fully the presence of Christ in his body of believers. You will experience God's grace personally through prayers and acts of service of a living community.

Emmaus is open to members of any denomination.

You might ask, Why should I attend an Emmaus Walk? Emmaus is for the development of Christian leaders who:

-Wish to strengthen their spiritual lives

-May have unanswered questions about prayer, study, and sharing their faith

-Understand that being a Christian involves responsibility

-Are willing to dedicate their everyday lives to God in an ongoing manner

-Have positions of responsibility in the church and the world

-Strengthen and renew the faith of Christian people

Although there is cost involved, by the generosity of our congregation giving when they have a birthday or anniversary there is no cost for anyone sponsored by our congregation. All you have to do is pray, accept God's invitation by filling out an application, pack a bag of casual clothes and have an open heart for what God has prepared for you.
